

### **EVIDENCE**

1 in 7 leave school early with only basic qualifications at best


Almost 20% (96 million) of current EU population are aged 15-29. By 2050, young people will probably be around 15%

Even before the current crisis, over 15% were unemployed (twice more than total population).


Around 20 % of young people in Europe are at risk of poverty





### A NEW STRATEGY YOUTH - INVESTING & EMPOWERING

### Overall objectives:

- To create more and equal opportunities for all young people in education and in the labour market
- 2. To promote active citizenship, social inclusion and solidarity of all young people



### MOBILISING ALL KEY POLICIES IN 27 MEMBER STATES

- Youth policy can't advance without effective coordination with other sectors
- Youth policies can contribute in areas such as child and family policy, education, employment, social inclusion, housing, healthcare and gender equality

### HOW IS THE STRATEGY IMPLEMENTED (2)?

Open method of coordination: (OMC)

- 1. All Member States agree on new strategy
- 2. MS report to the Commission every 3 years
- 3. Commission makes/publicises progress report
- 4. New fields of action and goals defined by the Member States and the Commission





### HOW IS THE STRATEGY IMPLEMENTED (3)?

- Evidence-base, more knowledge on youth
  - EU Youth Report
  - Dashboard of indicators
- Seminars, meetings, exchanging good practices
- Expert working groups
- And...: ACTIVE INVOLVEMENT OF YOUNG PEOPLE!



### YOUTH WORK

- Youth work can help to deal with unemployment, school failure, social exclusion, provide leisure time, increase skills and support the transition from youth to adulthood
- Youth work should be supported, recognised for its economic and social contribution, and professionalised

#### HOW ARE YOUNG PEOPLE INVOLVED?

#### THE STRUCTURED DIALOGUE:

- Based on working-cycles of 18 months
- Involves consultations with young people and youth organisations at all levels in the Member States and at EU conferences organised by Presidency countries and during the European Youth Week
- Implementation supported by **European Steering Committee** (representatives of young people, youth organisations, Trio-Presidencies, Ministries, the European Youth Forum, National Youth Councils, YiA National Agencies, European Commission)
- National Working Groups have been set up in all Member States
- Includes both «organised» and «non-organised young people»





- Youth has the strongest place ever in such an EU transversal process
- > Youth is at the very foundation of this process
- Complete coherence between EU2020 and the EU Youth strategy: Investing and Empowering
- The EU youth cooperation framework, has a strong cross-sectoral dimension!
